- 3. Who would your SFM program serve? Users? Who would participate in an SFM program? Students? Who at your institution or another institution has to participate in the curriculum?**

- 4. What resources do you need? Asynchronous learning? Cross-institutional sharing? Inter-institutional? Subjects/courses -- conflict resolution, public relations, ethics, communications? What technology exists that allows for collaboration?**

1. A completed electronic version of the second focus group output form.
2. A transcript of focus group responses and important dialogue not included in the output form.
3. Comments regarding questions unanswered during your focus group.
